Dear Anne,

many thanks for your letter which arrived this morning.

I can fully understand your reticence to become involved in my claim against against my former employers. I agree that it would be wholly inappropriate and I have no wish to involve you in the employment dispute whatsoever.

I shall keep you informed about the progress of the employment case as well - but merely from a information perspective of course.

However, the information regarding my allegations of bribery and corruption, which has been shared with the SFO, is discrete from the Employment Tribunal and only relevant in as much as it triggered my pre-emptive return to the UK. I believe that as my MP, it would be advantageous for you to know the background to the allegations since they are currently the subject of Cabinet discussions and a decision of the progress of the SFO case is imminent from your colleague the Attorney General. I am sure that your colleagues will be aware that I am one of your constituents and might well ask whether you are properly informed of the case. I am also seeking your advice as to whether I should report my discoveries to the Financial Reporting Council and the Audit Committee of the relevant banks who made the international bank transfers?

I look forward to hearing from you and at the due time, meeting you in future
